## What's next? Here's what happens after applications are submitted.

The final step in applying for Department of Justice (DOJ) funding is to submit your completed application in JustGrants. Every funding opportunity has its own JustGrants submission deadline. Submit your application early to allow time to address errors.

Once the application deadline passes, DOJ will begin a thorough internal review of submitted applications. Here are some important things to know:

- Award notifications are generally made by the end of the federal fiscal year, which is September 30.
- If an application is selected for funding:
  - The assigned Application Submitter, Authorized Representative(s), and Entity Administrator will receive an email notice from JustGrants.
  - Users will see the new award under their entity's "Awards" section in JustGrants.
- DOJ provides information about funded awards on the <u>Office of Community Oriented Policing Services</u>, <u>Office of Justice Programs</u>, and <u>Office on Violence Against Women websites</u>.
